



Many of us like to share our travelling experiences with friends and family through holiday photos and videos, but for one Hurst Green resident, this hobby has seen him produce semi-professional travelogue films for local organisations to enjoy!

Over the past 20 years, Ray Young has travelled far and wide, taking in China, Hong-Kong, Indonesia, Sri Lanka, Tunisia, South Africa, Egypt, Kenya, France, USA, Peru, Argentina, Brazil, Tanzania, Costa Rica and others. For the last three years, Ray has been taking his Travelogues to local group meetings including those for Senior Citizens, Friendship, Womens Institutes, History, Church and others, for members to listen to and watch, and gain an insight into different cultures, cuisine, wildlife and flora of countries that many people may never have the chance to visit or experience.

Ray explains how it all started: 'By good fortune, my work in the music recording industry sent me to various parts of the world and I always took my video camera with me. I had a good grounding in camera operating ever since my Dad bought an 8mm movie camera in 1956. I fell in love with it and realised its potential for creativity. I later acquired a digital video camera and spent weeks editing the pictures,

adding music, sound effects and informative voice-overs, and I get immense satisfaction from people's reaction to the results. Each Travelogue show lasts about 60-75 minutes, including films of 30 minutes each. To show where we are in the world, I take very large scale maps showing the flights and continents being visited. I also take local artifacts, such as hand crafted animal models, huge Ostrich eggs and native articles.

I provide all the equipment necessary for each show. A 40 inch TV & DVD Player for groups up to 20, or a DVD projector, screen and loudspeakers for larger groups. No charge is made for the shows or travelling but as an authorised collector for The Kent Surrey Sussex Air Ambulance Fund, I do ask for a voluntary donation that goes entirely to this life saving Charity.

I am happy to say, through the generosity of all concerned, in the past three years, I have been able to send over £1,100 to the Air Fund. I am told It costs £180 every fill up, and £1600 every lift off, for each of the 2000 incidents they rush to attend'.

Letter from the **Vicar**

I do hope that you all enjoyed the wonderful summer that we had, that the heat wasn't too much for you and that you also managed to get some rest and relaxation in whatever way restores and energises you.

This time I thought that I would share a story that really reflects the heart of God towards each one of us.

The story is told of a village where the dowry paid by a prospective husband to the family of the woman he wanted to marry was paid in cows. A well-respected family with a beautiful daughter who was popular and accomplished might expect to be offered 6 cows when she married. This was rare though and most dowries were around 3 or 4 cows. There was a family who had four daughters and the youngest was very shy, she was awkward and clumsy; she was seen as being quite plain and she wasn't very good at anything at all. As the daughters grew up, the older three got married and the family was pleased to be offered 4 cows for each of them. However, the parents despaired that the youngest daughter would ever be asked to marry. "She isn't even worth 2 cows", they said and resigned themselves to the shame that no-one would want her.

Then one of the most handsome and wealthy young men in the village came to the youngest daughter's father and said to him, "I would like to marry your daughter and I will give you 8 cows for her". The father was astounded, he thought the young man had mistaken his daughter for someone else, but no, it was definitely his daughter that the young man wanted to marry. "But my daughter is not worth 8 cows", he said to him, "she is not even worth 2 cows". "She is worth 8 cows to me", he told the father, "and that is what I will give you". Well the shy, plain, awkward, youngest daughter was

married to that rich and handsome young man and as you can imagine there was much gossip about it around the village. But as time went on people began to notice changes in the young woman. She became more confident, she held her head up high and was no longer awkward and clumsy. She



began to get better and better at the things that she used to find so difficult and what is more, people realised that she was in fact quite beautiful. Her husband's love for her and confidence in her had enabled her to become the very best that she could be.

And that is a picture of God's love for every one of us. To God, we are all 8 cow women (even the men!). That is why Jesus came – to show us how much He loves us. If we receive His love, then His love for us will help us to grow and flourish and to become the very best person that we can be.


Living, loving and

Supporting Carers in East Sussex

Do you provide unpaid care and support for someone you care about, perhaps a neighbour, relative or friend? You may be one of the 65,000+ unpaid carers in East Sussex.

Care for the Carers is a charity that offers support and information for unpaid carers throughout East Sussex, to help ensure that no one is left to care alone.

Part of the charity's work involves running carers' information and wellbeing groups, offering counselling, creating social activities for carers to get a well-earned break, providing practical advice and financial information and offering a free East Sussex Carers Card, which gives discounts on goods and services offered by local businesses and organisations, i.e. discounted parking for £1.60 at Conquest Hospital in Hastings, and Eastbourne District General Hospital.

The closest carers group to Hurst Green run by the charity is its Carers Wellbeing Group, held in Battle on the 4th Tuesday of each month from 10am-12pm at Emmanuel Centre, Harrier Lane, Battle TN33 0FL, There is a Support Worker from Care for the Carers who is on hand and Carers are welcome to drop in anytime for a cuppa and a chat with other carers in the local area.
