

Neighbourhood plan in a nutshell

If judging by the number of resident surveys, public events and articles in this magazine is anything to go by, you would be hard pressed not to know by now that Hurst Green is creating a Neighbourhood Development Plan.

The plan's Steering Group and the various task groups producing the plan are made up of Parish Councillors of volunteers from the community, all who freely give up their time.

The plan will supersede the 2009 Parish Plan for Hurst Green and

is a document that allows local people to create a blueprint for our future. It allows the community to develop planning policies that reflect local priorities and has real legal weight. The whole community will then decide at a local referendum vote whether or not to bring the plan into force.

HURST GREEN

Following public feedback gained throughout 2018 and 2019 a number of key aims for the plan were initially proposed. These aims were subsequently confirmed and prioritised during public engagement events held in July 2019 and also via an electronic survey which was promoted on social media.

The Steering Group are keen to confirm that the following key aims, as voted upon by the community will form the basis of the Hurst Green Neighbourhood Plan.

Key Aims

1. Protect against inappropriate and speculative development and to provide greater control over how Hurst Green should be developed in the future.

- Improve public safety and reduce the harmful impact of road traffic, while providing sufficient parking for the community.
- Develop local planning policies for Hurst Green which development proposals need to adhere to.
- 4. Create an environment that encourages residents to live active, social, meaningful lives that promote good health and well-being.
- Bring forward action on facilities and improvements, which are needed by the village of Hurst Green; and the hamlets of Silver Hill and Swiftsden.
- Improve the visual appearance and overall perception of Hurst Green as a place where people want to live, work and visit.
- Enhance our existing, and create new open green spaces and improve access to the countryside.
- 8. Increase business, retail and tourism opportunities to encourage local employment, and grow the local economy.
- 9. Conserve and enhance the built and historic environment and improve the general street scene around the parish.

The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group meets in public on the third Tuesday of each month, while the various task groups meet as needed and tend to work together electronically. If you would like to get involved, we are always looking for more volunteers. Please do come along to our meetings — where you can be sure of a warm reception and the offer of a cup of tea!

Community Shop U P D A T E

SHAREHOLDERS AGREE TO BOARD RESOLUTION TO DEREGISTER

In the six weeks since the Hurst Green Community Shop closed, the Board has been working hard to ensure that the business that has run the Shop since it opened in 2013 – namely, Hurst Green Community Shop & Centre Ltd (HGCSC) – can pay off its creditors and settle its statutory obligations as employers and business owners.

Thanks to the support of local farm and catering businesses, most of the Shop equipment and appliances have now been sold and all local suppliers have been paid. Providing that the Shop can sell its few remaining assets – such as shelving systems, the sweet cart and some refrigeration appliances – the Shop will be in a position to deregister from its regulatory body, the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA).

A Special Meeting for shareholders was held at the Shop on 1 August at which the Board updated the attendees and asked them to vote on its recommendation to cancel the HGCSC's registration with the FCA. The shareholders present voted unanimously to support the resolution.

Over the next few weeks, the Board will continue to tie up the remaining lose ends and, as soon as the deregistration is complete, the premises will be handed back to the Parish Council for it to work with local residents to decide its future.

Letter from the Vicar

We have not long returned home from a wonderful holiday in Canada, and as usual I suffered from jet lag. There were headlines (again) recently about the importance of sleep and how the lack of it can cause significant health problems. Apparently the government are going to provide us with guidelines about how much sleep we should have. Actually these guidelines are already available on the Sleep Foundation website.

Following new research they have recently updated their recommendations and of course acknowledge that needs can vary tremendously; many of us remember Maggie Thatcher famously claiming to only ever need 4 hours a night! We don't seem to be as good generally at resting as we used to be. Our lives are just so busy and of course now we have Sunday Trading and so many sports being played on a Sunday. Family situations are often complex and with so many demands on our time we no longer really have a day of rest. Does it matter?

Well in our modern society we do seem to suffer from extremely high stress levels, and many people have to have time off from work with stress related illnesses. The reasons for this are manifold and by no means just related to Sunday no longer being a day of rest, but it is interesting that having a rest day is one of the 10 commandments. Did God just want us to have a day off to worship Him because He needs our worship? Of course not. All of the things that God commands us to do are in our own best interests and the interests of the communities that we live in. It is good for us to set aside a day to rest and there is plenty of research to show that practicing faith is also good for mental and physical health, happiness and general well being.

That is not to say that those who don't practice faith necessarily don't have good mental and physical health etc, just that practicing faith can be a positive contributing factor for




many people. In the original Hebrew the beginning of the book of Genesis (which records a pre-history oral tradition) is actually a sort of ancient allegorical prayer poem. It is designed to convey the nature of God and His relationship with His creation, in particular with human beings, the pinnacle of that creation. In it we are told that human beings were created on the 6th day and that the 7th day was a day of rest. In other words, human beings are designed to begin with rest, and then work from a place of being rested.

In our hectic modern lives we all too often do exactly the opposite, work ourselves until we collapse and then start again before we have fully recovered – not a healthy pattern of living at all. Even people who have retired and should be enjoying a slower pace of life and the rest they have earned over their working lives can find themselves busier than ever. There are no easy answers but we do need to understand our need for proper regular times of rest and of course a good night's sleep. God bless, Rev Annette

Gardening Tips

LATE SUMMER/ AUTUMN

Watering

Water garden thoroughly, do not just splash a little around the borders. Do this very early morning or in the evening.

Raspberries

Cut out this years' fruiting canes from early varieties. Choose 4 or 5 of this years' new wood (shoots) to tie into straining/support wires. Prune out all weak, damaged or dead growth. Raspberries love a thick mulch spread around their roots to conserve moisture.

Roses

Remove all dead flower heads. Give bushes a feed with something like Fish Blood and Bone. This will encourage a flush of blooms later this Autumn.

Hedges

Trim box yew, privet and conifers. Don't cut conifers too short as some will die back.

Collecting Seeds

Collect seed heads from plants you wish to grow next year. Don't collect and keep seeds in a plastic bag, as they will sweat and rot. Always use a brown bag for this purpose.

Lawns

Do not cut grass too short, no lower than 1½ inches (3.81cms), especially in dry weather, as this can damage the root system.

Hurst Green Brownies

Over the summer holiday we challenged our Brownies to complete at least one Interest Badge and we can't wait to see what they choose, because under the new Brownie Programme we are now following there are 18 new Interest Badges that the girls complete at home. The Badges cover some old favourite topics like Collecting, Baking and Dancing but also now include new subjects like Mindfulness, Inventing and Aviation.

We have had one amazing outing this summer with a small group of girls going to the open day for Olave 2019, International Guide Camp at Blacklands Farm



camp site near East Grinstead. Hundreds of Guides from around the world camped for 10 days, alongside girls from East Sussex.

We met guides from Nigeria and Ireland but there were also girls there from Australia, Greece, Malaysia, USA and Japan. It was an amazing opportunity for the Brownies to see what they could be part of if they move on to Guides but it was also great fun too as the girls got to go bungy trampolining, played crazy golf, tried out some circus skills, used virtual reality headsets to take a tour of the South Downs sky at night, looked round a fire engine, made a badge and got their faces painted too.
