Your village needs you!

At the end of May 2020, visitors from our twinned village of Ellerhoop, in north west Germany are coming to visit. This visit will last for four days and the Hurst Green Twinning Committee are seeking volunteer families and households to host our visitors for this period.

Long term residents of Hurst Green will know that the village has been twinned for almost forty years, with residents of each village taking it in turns to visit the other every other year. 2020 is the turn of our German friends to visit and it would be great if we could host as many as possible. The last few years has seen a resurgence in interest in the twinning, with over 25 Hurst Greeners travelling to Germany this year for an amazing, enjoyable few days. Next year's visit will be just as successful and is planned to fall on the same weekend as the village fête, meaning our visitors can see Hurst Green in all its glory and experience its amazing hospitality.

So, what does hosting involve?

Hosting is a voluntary role, and involves you giving a bed (or two!) to a German guest (or two!) who will stay with you. You will also need to feed them, although often when our guests visit a destination like London you might need to make them a packed lunch, or they might choose to eat out. All our guests are incredibly polite and speak impeccable English, and range in age and experience from late teens to older people. It doesn't matter if you don't live in Hurst Green itself any of the surrounding villages would be ideal. If you are able to be available to transport your guest to events, then great. If not, we will work with you to arrange to do that.

In return, as well as knowing that you have helped out your community and extended



the hand of friendship to our European neighbours, you will of course be making new friends – and in 2021 when Hurst Green return to Germany perhaps you'll choose to come with us?

The dates for the planned visit are from 28/05/2020 – 01/06/2020.

Free TV retuning

Since there has been a change in the transmitter for our area, several people have lost the ability to reach certain channels, especially 'Freeview'. If you are having problems just call 0808-100-0288 they will give you advice and try to fix the problem. If not, they will come to your house and reset everything and in some cases replace the antenna. There is NO CHARGE for this service, although you may have to wait a few days for an appointment. It is offered for 3 months after each retuning of the transmitter, so keep the number for future problems!

Marie Lillian Bird

Marie Cronk was born in South London, Kennington, within the sound of the 'Bow Bells'on 18th November 1930, she was the younger sister of Eileen. Sadly, their Father died when Marie was very young.

During the war they were bombed out of their home twice and evacuated with their mother first to Yeovil and then to Cullompton in Devon. Marie went to school at Notre Dame Convent in Kennington, she was very bright, and the nuns wanted her to move on to further education, but Marie just wanted to go out to work. Marie's first job was in a bank, where she met George a strapping young man keen on Rugby and the outdoor life. They were soon to be married and, never interested in keeping up with others, their life was hard working but fun. Marie loved to dance and this was also one of their favourite pastimes together.

Shortly after they were married they became parents with the arrival of Anne. Whilst still living in London they were dealt a devastating life changing blow. When Anne was just 2 years old George contracted polio. The family were told to expect the worst but George and Marie were having none of it. George spent 2 years in hospital recovering although he would be paralysed for life. When George was discharged from hospital they moved to St Paul's Cray. There, along with many other families who were relocating, they were part of a building a new community and making life-long friends.

Marie's support and love through those years was unbelievable. The hardship



bringing up a young family was stressful enough but to have a husband hospitalised for such a long time and so far away made her stronger than ever. This strength of partnership was to mould the family for ever and the values installed at this time have been passed on to future generations. There was a further addition to the family in 1959 when Steve was born.

Marie and George always tried to have family holidays, caravanning in the countryside and venturing further afield to places such as Portugal, Spain and France, always a big adventure. George now became a builder along with his father and a new chapter of Marie's life began.

The next house move was to Orpington where Sandra was born in 1966. In 1988 the family made a move much further afield to the countryside of Hurst Green. This home was the start of new beginnings, new friends and becoming part of a whole new community.

Marie and George were lucky enough to see all their children happily married, the joy of grandchildren who then moved on to happy marriages, relationships and great grandchildren. One of Marie's greatest pleasures was her grandchildren!

After George passed away in 1996, Marie's strength and fun-loving kind heart kicked in once more. She didn't give up, her friendship with Morag became stronger, both serving as Comedy Capers tea ladies! Marie made many new lifelong friends in the village, being part of the community and was often seen playing bowls, at coffee mornings and playing games at one another's houses. Her love of music and dance together with some of her lady friends culminated in the formation of 'The Scrubbers' song and dance act which brought much joy to all who saw it whilst raising much needed funds for charity.

Marie's 80th Birthday was an occasion she really enjoyed, friends and family coming together to have a wonderful evening that none of us will forget especially when the Comedy Capers gang sang happy birthday. Marie spent many happy times with friends in the village hall which was an important place in her heart. It is only fitting that her wake was held there and supported by the whole family, many of her friends and local people.

The family would like to thank everybody for their kind support and messages in a very difficult time. It is warming to see that Marie was loved as much by the local community as she was by us. Marie's happy presence will be missed by everyone who knew her.

Gardening Tips for the Winter

- Dig over empty borders and prepare your soil for next year's planting.
- Group potted plants together in a sheltered spot in the garden to protect them from the harshest winter weather.
- Get pruning wisteria, fruit trees, roses and acers and vines are just some of the plants that benefit from a winter prune.
- Look after the birds clean feeders, stock up on fat balls and make sure they have access to fresh water.
- Leave the faded flower heads on your hydrangeas until spring, as they provide frost protection to the swelling buds further down the stems.
- If any of your rose bushes suffered from blackspot or rust this summer, gather up and remove any fallen leaves to reduce the chance of infection next year.
 - Spread fresh gravel or grit around alpine plants.
 - Lift and divide established clumps of rhubarb to renew the plant's vigour. Sections taken from the outside of the plant are better than those from the centre.
 - If your strawberry plants are over 3 years old, order some new strawberry runners to replace them. Old strawberry plants can harbour diseases and tend to lose vigour and productivity.

Harvest

At the recent Harvest Thanksgiving service we heard how our gifts of tinned and packet food for Hastings Foodbank will be used to help families who are struggling to feed themselves. There has been an increase in the uptake of this service over the past year or so and the need is growing among working families on low incomes or Universal Credit.

Hastings Foodbank is part of The Trussell Trust's network of 428 foodbanks, working to tackle food poverty and hunger in our local communities, as well as across the UK.

The Foodbank Network was founded in 2004 after four years of developing the original foodbank based in Salisbury. Since then The Trussell Trust has helped communities work together to launch foodbanks nationwide in a wide range of towns and cities.

In 2018/19, The Trussell Trust's Foodbank Network provided 1,583,668 three-day emergency food supplies and support to UK people in crisis. Of these, 577,618 went to children. To find out more about The Trussell Trust visit www.trusselltrust.org

At Holy Trinity, we are supporting this by continuing to collect food items in a box along with hygiene products which we will pass on to the Food and Hygiene Banks. Donations can be added on Wednesday mornings at the Renew Café or at a Sunday service.

Our next one will be in **February half term Monday 17th– Wednesday 19th**. On the back of this we are planning to start a monthly Sunday Club in the church for children aged 5-11. It will be every 1st Sunday from 9-10am. Our vision is to let children know about the Christian faith and beliefs by looking at the Bible and learning what God has to say to us today.
