In case any of you haven't seen it, a young alien girl and an earth boy strike up an unlikely friendship while she is repairing her spaceship. They get in to amusing scrapes along the way, and then she's gone, except that now that the boy knows that she exists, she will never really be gone.

At first glance this advert seems to have very little to do with Christmas, in fact mirrors in many ways the original Christmas story.

Jesus too came from beyond our world, with power to heal, to provide, to forgive. He pointed to far vaster truths than our everyday world lets us imagine. He taught us the best way to love, and showed us the true meaning of love, ultimately dying for our salvation.
